



We recognise that there have been other conflicts since the World War's, for example Iraq and Afghanistan. The second phase of Northern Powergrid's excavation work along Woodall Lane which started in mid-October is progressing well and in line with the schedule the company shared in early October 2023.

Contractors Balfour Beatty have completed works at the Harthill end of Woodall Lane and on the section adjoining Pryor Mede and Spens Field and are now working on the final section of road to be closed as part of Northern Powergrid's £7.7 million investment in the local electricity infrastructure.

The road is currently closed between Harthill Reservoir to just past the junction of Walseker Lane, with resident access from the Harthill end of Woodall Lane. This section is due for completion in the first week of December 2023, after which Woodall Lane will reopen for the remainder of the month.

Completion works will begin in January 2024 (firm date to be confirmed) and run until approximately Easter 2024. This work will be carried out using temporary two-way traffic lights and Northern Powergrid would like to stress there are no further road closures planned.

The work involves digging five intermittent joint bays in the roadway/grass verges along Hard Lane, Union Street, Woodall Lane and Killamarsh Lane. These small excavations are dug to allow section of the new electricity cables to be pulled into the ducting that has already been laid in the roadway and then joined together.

Grass verges and any damaged areas of the roadway/footpath will be fully reinstated once the full programme of works has been completed.

Harthill Cricket Club

When I wrote my last article towards the end of August there was an on-going concern that the First Team were going to be relegated from the Championship after just one season. Following a very strong end to the season, where 4 out of 5 games were won, we finished joint 6th in a league of 12 teams.

In this run, we beat Ordsall Bridon away by 28 runs, successfully defending 156 (Dom Cumming 36, Luke Lodge 32) and then the wickets were shared amongst Chris Page (2-17), Bradie Shaw (3-35), Dom (2- 29) & Connor Graham (2-13). This was followed up with a 22-run victory over Bawtry, who at the time were in the mix to win the league. Reece van Staden top scored with 59 in our under-par total of 153 all out. We bowled Bawtry out for 131, with Chris Page and Dom Cumming taking 3 wickets each.

The following weekend the calendar flipped over to September which meant the start time moved forward to 11.30 am and we had a long-drive to North Wheatley for a game against another team challenging for the title. We had an under-strength team but posted an impressive 253/8 with Dom Cumming (87) and Chris Radford (59) scoring his first half century for the 1st team being the leading scorers. We bowled North Wheatley out for 215

to win by 38 runs with Reece van Staden taking 4-29 off 10 overs and Bradie Shaw taking 3 outstanding catches.



Special mentions for Will Bloodworth who faced up bravely to one of the fastest bowlers in the league and fielded brilliantly, and Graham Shaw who took the winning catch and is believed to still be running home celebrating 2 months later. Having secured our safety there was a real party atmosphere at Thorpe Road on a baking hot day for the last home game of the season against Mansfield Hosiery

Mills, with the "cheerleaders" expertly led by Dave Poucher, Pat Hurt and Jason Drake being a particular highlight. Mansfield compiled 236/8 with Chris Page taking 3 wickets. Harthill raced to victory for the loss of just 2 wickets with 11 overs remaining. Phil Higginson scoring 73 and Dom Cumming 110 not out.

For the last game of the season, we went to Anston with confidence hoping to cause one final upset and derail their league title ambitions. Unfortunately, we were very well beaten by the best team we had played all season. We only managed 136 all out off 49.3 overs with Anston knocking the total off for the loss of 3 wickets in just 21 overs. Congratulations to Anston on an outstanding season and a fully deserved league title.

The Second Team's season finished around the time of my last article so there are no game updates, but they have had an outstanding season finishing third in the table. As it stands, it is only the top two teams who get promoted but if there is a restructure of the leagues, we will be going up.

Councillors Winter Update

We sincerely hope everyone is looking forward to a happy and peaceful Christmas period with friends and loved ones. Christmas is a time for friendship, good deeds and family, and whilst we all have busy lives, we should cherish this fellowship and the time we have to share with others.

As ever, there are a number of updates we wanted to give you this month in relation to things happening in the villages of Harthill and Woodall. We are pleased that three of our local roads will be resurfaced next year, likely around March time. This includes, Northlands following the major drainage works, South Farm Avenue and part of Walseker Lane.

As we continue to champion Harthill and Woodall and seek to attract investment from the Council, we will see several local improvements next Summer. The footpaths on Winney Hill and Union Street will be newly resurfaced as we know how much in need of repair they are. Following reports over many years of speeding at various locations in the village, and after consultation with residents which was overwhelmingly supportive, speed humps will be installed on Thorpe Road, Hard lane (entering the village) and on Woodall Lane at Woodall. We wanted to incorporate all of Woodall Lane, but the funds are limited and sadly wouldn't stretch along the entire stretch into Harthill. These works will entail little disruption.

Like many residents, we remain frustrated by the impact Northern Powergrid works have had on some of our most vulnerable residents and on our local businesses. We will be glad when the works are complete, which should be very soon. We have been tremendously busy assisting individuals on a variety of issues caused by the works. If for yourself, or if you know of anyone who requires assistance or advice, please get in touch. We want to help.

Finally, we hope to see you at the many Christmas get togethers and community events over the coming weeks. Don't forget we have our regular drop-in advice surgeries at Harthill Leisure Centre 1st and 2nd Saturday of the month 10 am - 11 am.

Canal & River Trust

The newly upgraded Harthill Reservoir spillway has been serving its purpose well during the heavy rainfall from recent storms. The Trust is continuing to closely monitor water levels in the reservoir and carry out 'fish rescues' as required (in cases whereby raised water levels have caused small numbers of fish in the top pond to transfer into the bottom pond).

We would like to thank everyone who has fed back on our fishing platform designs, an amended planning application is being submitted by the end of November.

Your patience as we carry out this reservoir upgrade project is appreciated. The team are working hard to complete this by the end of March 2024, although prolonged periods of heavy rainfall and recent storms are likely to have an impact on this and updates will be posted on our webpage - Harthill Reservoir upgrade | Canal & River Trust (canalrivertrust.org.uk)
